Obedience wanted

Last month I told you one of my favorite parts in the bible that I go to often. This month I want to reintroduce you to another area in the Bible. This month's message comes from the book of Deuteronomy. Many scholars call this the book of laws. In it you will find the Ten Commandments (Chapter 5). If you can remember, these were written for the people of Israel because they had just been rescued from the land of Egypt. When Moses came down from the mountain with these commandments, the people were already partying and worshiping the golden calf. Once again, having saved from Egypt, given food and water, they now were forgetting the one who saved them.

This is one of the first five books of the Bible and is also named the Torah. Our Jewish brothers and sisters read these 5 books every year. It is the way of reminding them about our God and what He has done and the demand for obedience He requires from each and every one of His people. As a child I had to memorize the Ten Commandments. Maybe you did too. How long has it been since you looked at them and studied them through adult eyes? I will just take the first commandment and see what our adult eyes will see. "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, you shall have no other gods before me," He is still our God. Where was your land of Egypt that He rescued you from? Think about that for a second. What was your house of slavery that He rescued you from. Are these hard questions? They were words you learned at a young age but now I ask you to look at them as an adult. The last part is even harder. What others gods are in your life where you have pushed God into second or third place. Someone told me that these commandments are just a suggestion. I beg to tell you that they are our Laws to live by. God is still seeking your obedience. Maybe after reviewing the fifth chapter with a lot of pauses for thought, you may want to pledge you allegiance to God and move him to the top of

your list, striking all other gods from your list. It is never too late.
