# Shriners Hospitals for Children – Houston

Julio and Armando are brothers who have been making great strides at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Houston.

Since age 2, Julio and Armando have had spastic paraparesis and lower extremity contractures, which causes weakness in their legs. Initially, to get around, they would bunny hop at home and use homemade chairs with wheels attached to them. They were dependent on family and friends to move around at school and to get in and out of cars.

The boys did not receive any help or diagnosis of their condition until they were seen at our Laredo clinic in November 2016, followed by care at the Houston Shriners Hospital beginning March 2017. The lower extremity orthopaedic surgery and rehabilitation the boys received at Shriners Hospitals has changed their lives.

Julio, 13, is now able to walk a distance of up to 300 feet independently with a reverse walker. His younger brother Armando, 12, is able to reach the same distance with long leg braces and an arm support walker.

The brothers have proven to be a dynamic duo who have inspired many at our Houston Shriners Hospital with their smiles and cheerful attitude. They have continued to be driven and very motivated through the many milestones they reach. In April, both boys cheered as they were recognized as our patients of the month.

The boys have also prepared to trade-in their homemade chairs for customized wheelchairs. Julio and Armando continue to surpass many obstacles with their high spirits and truly represent what Shriners Hospitals for Children is all about.

# News from the Houston Hospital

The Houston Hospital recently had its Joint Commission review. This is an independent organization that has been accrediting hospitals over 60 year and today it accredits approximately 4,168 hospitals. This organization provides a surprise audit every three year and in April they arrived. After several days of reviews the Houston Hospital received excellent marks in all categories. The joint commission surveyors had very complementary remarks about the nurses and staff

Over the past couple of months the hospital has been working on two additions to the hospital. Currently underway is a new chapel. The Houston Hospital has received a generation donation to convert an existing room into a chapel. Also the hospital has received donations from the imperial first lady's

programs for a sensory room. A sensory room is a special room designed to develop a person's senses, usually through special lighting, music, and objects. Research has shown that sensory play can benefit nearly all children who are hospitalized, from youngsters who can play independently to those who need a full rehabilitation programs. Such programs can include physiotherapy and speech and language therapy to re-learn cognitive, motor, language and daily living skills. The room should be available to patients by the end of summer.

Our Houston Hospital clinics are truly working clinics where we fit and supply prosthesis on location. Many children cannot make the trip to Houston for treatment, so we take the Hospital to them. Recently, we have seen an increase of children to our outreach clinics. Listed below are next outreach clinics dates.


