





The Late Albert P. Groebl

If you're a Suez Shriner, you have heard of Albert P. Groebl. If not, let me introduce you to him......

This article was printed in the San Angelo Evening Standard, Thursday, May 21, 1959

The following biography telling the story of the Shriner and his bequest.

Albert P. Groebl was Born in St. Louis MO, January 2, 1902. He moved to San Francisco in October, 1907. His schooling included Fairmont Grammar School, Mission High School in San Francisco and the University of California at Berkeley.

He became a Master Mason at Mount Davidson Lodge, San Francisco, in 1924. He also was a member of Casimir Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star in San Francisco.

In early 1927, he sold out his business interests in California and went around the world and returned through Rankin, TX about November 1927 to visit with his mother and brother, Ted O. Groebl who had moved to Rankin.

'18 Dry Wildcat's'

He was impressed with the country around Rankin and permanently moved there in February, 1928. He first entered partnership with his mother and brother, Ted O. Groebl, in the operation of a service station and tire sales. Later, he branched out into an oil jobbership and began purchasing oil leases and royalties. He drilled 18 wildcat oil ventures, all dry.

He first obtained oil production in 1939 and sold out his interest in oil jobbing in 1944 to his brother, Ted, and thereafter devoted his full time to oil, ranching, and oil exploration. He was in the Air Corps in the second World War in 1941.

'Visited Frisco Hospital'

At an early age, Albert took an interest in the Shriners Hospital for crippled Children. The Shrine had just recently completed its Children's Hospital in San Francisco in which he visited often, especially when the San Francisco hospital was dedicated. The impression there on his visits to the Shriners Hospital, was a lasting one on his heart and mind. He was impressed with the great work that the Shriners were carrying on to help children. This devotion to children was carried with him with increasing devotion forever.

Al became a Shriner in the spring of 1928 at El Maida Temple in El Paso TX. He was a member of their Patrol. 'Charter Member'

Al was a charter member of Suez Temple. His was very interested in the Shriners Hospitals and he handled the polo drive in San Angelo. He loved Shrinedom and was in constant attendance at the ceremonials and conventions. Albert P. Grorbl died of a heart attack May 31, 1952 at the Shannon Hospital in San Angelo TX. His estate gave 90 per cent to Shriners Hospitals and 10 per cent to Suez Shrine Temple. It has been estimated that Shriners Hospitals has already received in excess of \$350,000 and it has been conservatively estamated that through the years to come his estate will pay in excess of a total of 1 Million to Shriners Hospitals. Shriners is a one of the best known philanthropy on earth.

We would like to Thank Al P. Groebl for his donation to Suez Shrine Temple so many years ago. Even after 73 years, Suez still receives royalties. We do not know if the Shrine hospitals still receive from his donations, but Suez is truly grateful for Noble Al P. Groebl and his love for the Shrine hospitals and for Shriners. Ted O. Groebl, Al's brother, was Suez Potentate in 1962.

- V. My fellow members and I ARE the Shrine. Without our ACTIVE support, it ceases to exist.
- VI. My Temple does me a favor by calling upon me — I am not doing the Temple a favor by serving. It is both an obligation and a privilege.
- VII. I should treat my fellow nobles with the respect, honor, and understanding that I would like to receive from them.
- VIII. It is not a right to be a noble, it is an honor. I should respect that honor by abiding by all of the Shrine's precepts.
- IX. Whatever differences my fellow nobles and I may have, we are all bound together by bonds of our loyalty to the Temple and to Masonry.
- X. The noble is the lifeblood of the Temple and the Shrine.

Ziphron Temple No. 100 Daughters of the Nile March Update


Early 2025 has been filled with plenty of excitement and activity for Ziphron Temple No. 100.
