## More than just a game

*My Fellow Nobles,*

It is with a heavy heart that I must inform you that we have cancelled the 2021 East-West Shrine Bowl™ due to challenges presented by COVID-19.

This decision was extremely difficult to make. After consulting with our key partner – the NFL – along with countless leaders within the intercollegiate athletics community and the professional and college scouting community, we came to the conclusion that the risks were too great for the upcoming game. Once the NFL cancelled the Pro Bowl earlier this month, it became even more clear that we would need to take a one-year pause.

Although it is heart-breaking for us as Shriners, I know you will all agree that the safety and well-being of our athletes and attendees is our overriding concern.

Bob Roller, our executive director of the East-West Shrine Bowl, has been working on this issue for months. “It’s terribly

disappointing to have to cancel this year’s game, but there are so many issues involved with bringing in approximately 130 players and 25 NFL coaches from every corner of the United States and Canada,” he said. “It’s difficult enough currently for these college teams to provide some sort of a bubble during the regular season, but our game occurs after all players have gone home for the holidays and presented too many potential issues for this one year.”

Players eligible for the 2021 game will still receive formal invitations and become a part of the historical 96-year tradition.

We all look forward to when this pandemic is over and we can get back to doing all the things we love, including this well-loved Shriners tradition, the East-West Shrine Bowl.

What is the Fun and Fellowship Competition?

The Fun and Fellowship Competition is designed to help bring fun and fellowship back to our fraternity, and to recognize those who have come up with solutions to having fun during the pandemic.

How do I enter the competition?

Fill out the short form to enter. There is no limit to the number of activities and/or ideas you can submit, as long as each submission is unique. Entries will be accepted from Oct. 27 – Dec. 16, 2020.

Who can enter? Current members of Shriners International can enter the competition.

What are the competition categories?

- Adapted an existing temple, club or unit event to have fun during the pandemic
- Created a new temple, club or unit event, or formed a new unit to have fun during the pandemic
- Propose an entirely new idea on how to have fun, which has not yet occurred

How will the finalists be selected?

After the submission deadline has passed, the Fun and Fellowship Council will evaluate each entry according to a judging rubric and will narrow the entries to the top five finalists within each of the three categories.

What happens after the finalists are chosen?

Each of the 15 finalists will be asked to record a short video (no more than 30 seconds) explaining their unit/club/event/idea. The videos will be uploaded to a platform and posted online and on social media. Viewers will then have the chance to watch the videos and vote for their favorite activity/idea in each of the three categories.

Who can vote?

We encourage all members of our extended Shriners family to vote, including nobles, ladies, family members, friends and members of affiliated Masonic organizations and ladies' organizations. Please note: you can only vote one time in each category. The voting will take place from Feb. 11 – March 25, 2021.

How will the winners be announced and acknowledged?

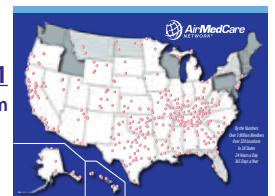
