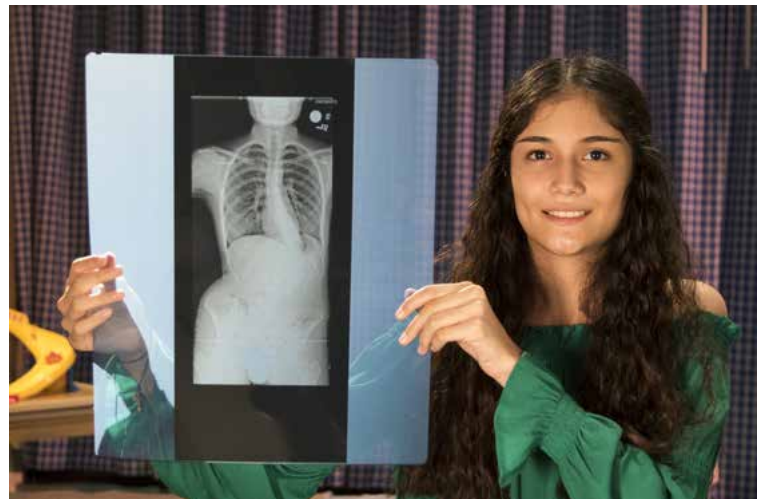

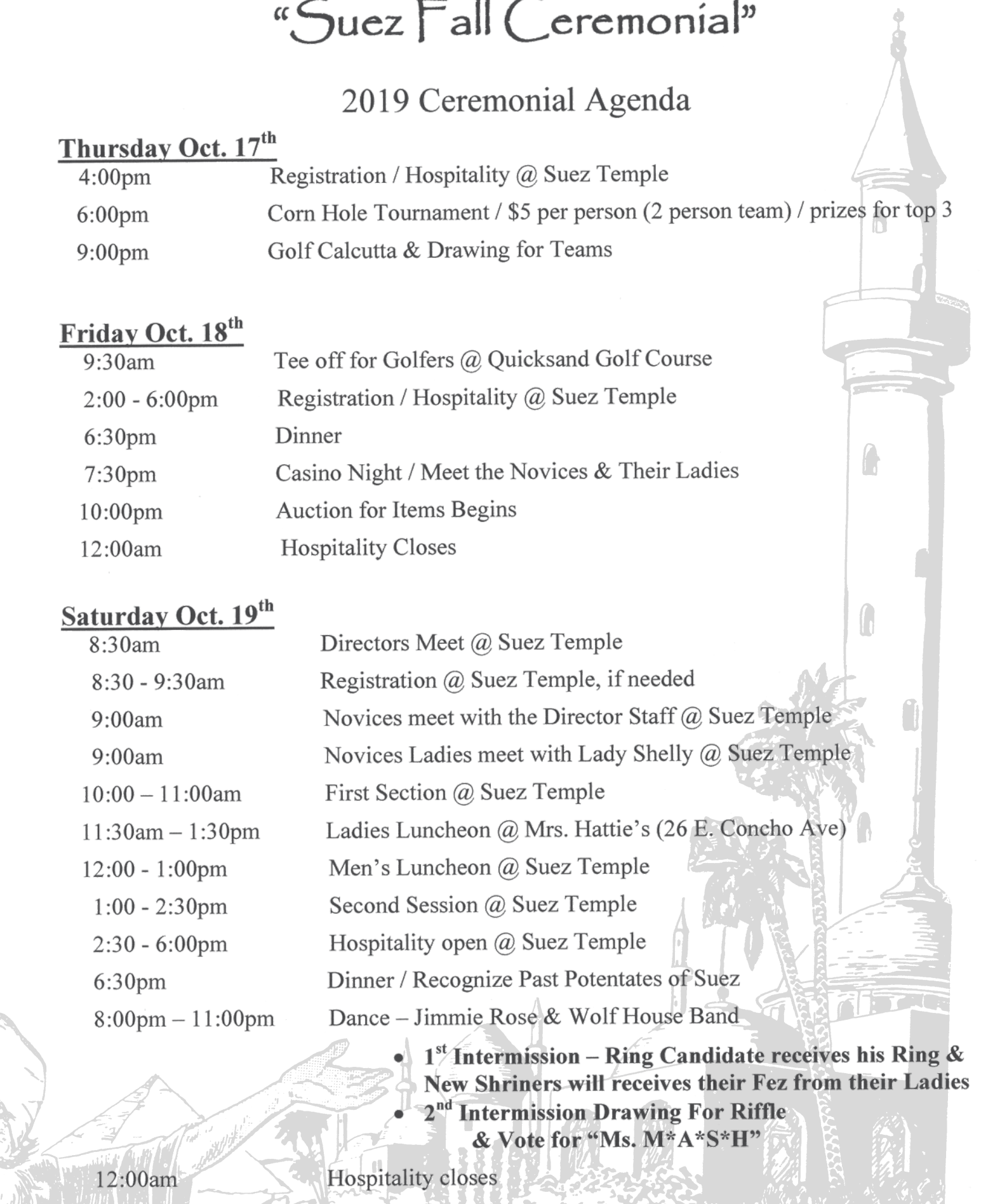

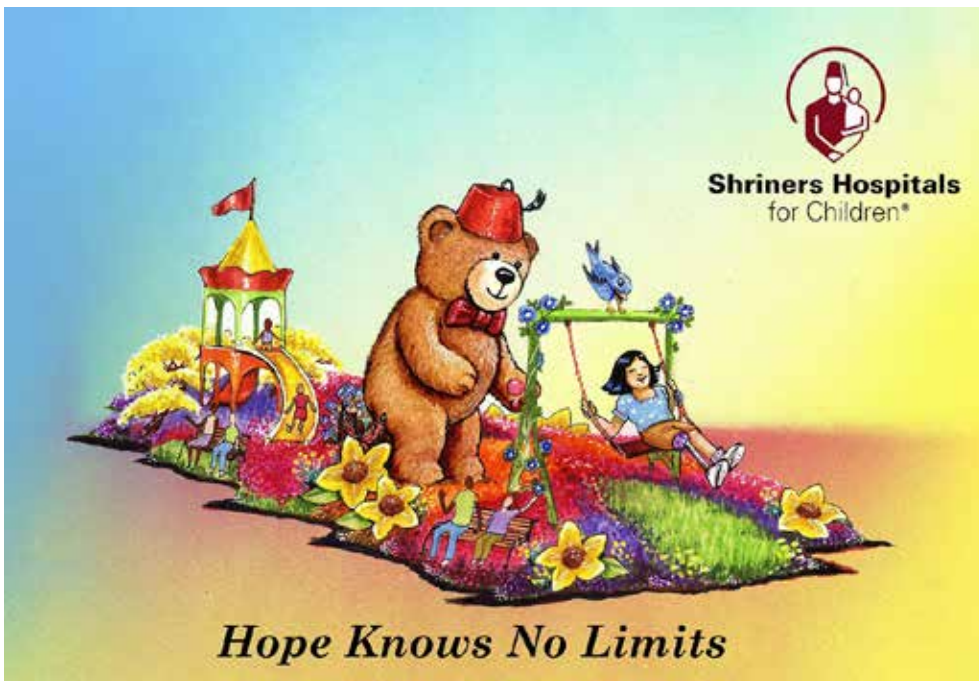
Suez
